Happy New Year! Our first news sheet of 2024 and we have been eager to share what we've been up to!


Firstly, I want to say a big big thank you to the CSA for funding some new equipment in Preschool. The children have been busy using their imagination with the Architecture set, reading in our outdoor wooden teepee and exploring all sorts in the discovery table. We are very grateful, thank you!



Our topic for this term is people, and more specifically, people who help us. So far we have gathered all of our ideas during circle times and produced a mind map. As a group, we have been recalling our personal experiences with these people. We are looking forward to exploring this topic further in the coming weeks

Phonics sessions are back up and running again with the children showing so much enthusiasm for their monster friends! This week we have had a focus on Green Froggy, the children noticed that saying the 'ee' sound makes their mouths turn into a smile. A very clever way to remember the sound!

Overall, the children have come back to preschool eager to learn and explore more through their play. They have settled back into routines amazingly well and as always, we are super proud of them!

Happy New Year! We have started the Spring Term by thinking about our topic Way Down Under! All of the children in Springbok Class will have been given a copy of the new homework sheet for the topic and they are able to earn house points for the different activities which are completed throughout the term. Any work completed at home will then be displayed on our learning journey in the cloakroom of Springbok classroom.

Year 1 and 2 have enjoyed taking part in a quiz during the first two days back. This quiz had lots of questions about last terms topic. All of the children tried extremely hard during the buzzer and house rounds - congratulations to Ted and Oscar for being the highest scoring team in the quiz!



For the next two weeks in Year 1 and 2 English lessons we will be learning about the book Ossiri and Bala Mengro. As part of this learning all of the children had the opportunity to create a rainbow, using pieces of material and art resources - please do have a look at these on display in the classroom!





We have also been learning about Judaism and about synagogues. We thought about what we were grateful for and how Shabbat is an important day in the Jewish religion. We hope everyone enjoyed trying the Challah bread which they took home! Year R children have been continuing to develop their letter formation. They will now have a homework book with some handwriting ideas which can be completed at home. The homework will be handed out each week on a Friday and we ask that this then arrives back in school on the following Thursday. Please continue to read with your child regularly at home and record this in their yellow reading record books.

Vixen

We have had a wonderful first week back in Vixen starting our new topic 'Guardians of the planet'. Our first few lessons have been answering the question 'What is Earth?' through geography. Vixen have learnt all about time zones, the North and South hemispheres and the lines of latitude and longitude.

Latitude and longitude



In writing, we have been exploring culture stories. Our focus book is called *We are Water Protectors* by Carole Lindstrom. This week, we did some sentence stacking lessons which set the scene for how important water is. On Thursday, we wrote our short write about a black snake which was poisoning Earth and destroying the planet.

As we start a fresh term, please remember that all children must do 15 minutes of Times Tables Rockstars per week. This is really important for supporting their maths as well as preparing them for the Y4 multiplication check. Additionally, they have their handwriting homework which will look slightly different for some children in the class. If you have any worries or need a reminder of the TTRS password, please come speak to me.

Firefly

Welcome back one and all to a new term in Firefly class! Everyone has come back with brilliant enthusiasm that we have used to shape some incredible learning. They have also done a phenomenal job with our new class arrangements, showing their resilience to change and utilising their collaboration to continue our progress we made last term.

In writing we have focused on culture stories in both classes, revisiting some of our core skills like capital letters to support new learning and use of advanced vocabulary. This has been shown in some amazing independent pieces that we will build on next week.


In maths, both year groups have shown us their great retrieval skills by completing their Multiplication and Division Baseline assessments, before starting our new learning next week.

We have also begun our new topic this term, becoming “Guardians of the planet” to explore how we can view the world. We have covered the main lines of latitude and longitude as well as how to create coordinates to explore the globe.

We have also completed our RE for the half term, exploring how faith shapes the lives and identities of Muslims.

Finally we have explored classification in Science in the last two weeks, using classification keys to group animals based on their characteristics.


Here's just a snapshot of what we've been up to:

As we move into this term there are some shifts in our Homework expectations, to support our Year 6 cohort with their preparation and confidence for SATs. They will still be expected to complete handwriting and TTRS homework, set on Friday and due on Thursday and Friday respectively.

They will also receive their first CGP books next Monday, to be returned the following week. They are expected to answer and mark their work independently, having an additional attempt at maths questions if their answer doesn't match (we will send purple pens home so it is the same as at school). This homework is optional, but will support learning this term. It allows us to identify any topics that we can revisit as well as boosting their confidence in handling a larger workload, ready for high school. If you have any worries or concerns, please come and chat to me or send an email.



We also have some optional homework for all of Firefly to take part in this half term, to support our Topic lessons and for children to celebrate their learning. Your child should have been sent home with a homework sheet, so please ask for one if they haven't. Here are some examples of the amazing work we've already seen:

Holidays During Term Time

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
